STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Pool Selling.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 136, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 136 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed, and the following section enacted in place thereof:
- 'Sec. 4. Pool selling; penalty. Whoever engages or participates in any pool, "nigger pools" so-called, or the writing, printing, advertising, purchasing, receiving or offering for sale any ticket, token, certificate, share or interest therein, directly or indirectly, giving away or having in possession with intent to sell or dispose of any such ticket or token which entitles the holder to the proceeds or share of proceeds of any prize or award of money as a result of any number or combination of numbers on said token or ticket shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$4000, nor less than \$1000, and by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or less than 1 year.'
