STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Requiring Witnesses to be Seated While Testifying.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Witnesses to be seated while testifying. Witnesses in court or in any judicial proceedings shall be seated while giving testimony, except at such times as the nature of the testimony requires them to stand.
