STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Authorize the Plantation of Pleasant Ridge to Withdraw from the Maine Forestry District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Pleasant Ridge Plantation may withdraw from the forestry district. The plantation of Pleasant Ridge in the county of Somerset may by vote at any meeting of its inhabitants, duly called and held, withdraw from the Maine Forestry District. A copy of such vote certified by the town clerk shall be forwarded forthwith to the treasurer of state and the forest commissioner and from the time such certified copy is filed in the office of the treasurer of state, said town shall cease to be a part of the Maine Forestry District.
