STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Non-residents Camping without Guides.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 51-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 51-A. Non-residents; camping without guides. Non-residents shall not camp in trailers or tents along any of the highways or on any of the public camp sites of the state, during the months of October, November and December each year, unless accompanied by a resident of the state and if there are more than 2 non-residents in the party, a registered guide must be employed.'
