STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relative to Sale of Fish.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 26, amended. Section 26 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 26. Sale of certain fish prohibited, penalty. Whoever by himself, his clerk, servant, or agent, directly or indirectly, sells or purchases any landlocked salmon, trout, togue, black bass, or white perch fresh water fish, shall pay a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$30, and costs of prosecution, for each offense, and in addition thereto \$1 for each fish sold, purchased, or had in possession in violation of this section, except, however, fish taken under section 30 of this chapter and further excepting white fish taken outside of the state of Maine, provided all persons engaged in the transportation and sale of said white fish shall secure a permit from the commissioner so to do.'
