AN ACT Authorizing Certain Cities to Enact Ordinances Respecting Parking Meters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Authorization to make contracts for meters. Cities having a population of over 10,000 inhabitants may make contracts for the exercise of its corporate powers for the installation, operation, maintenance,—subject to such laws as may be applicable,—of mechanical traffic signal light systems, signs, signals, markings, parking meters, or other devices and systems for the control and regulation of traffic on the ways within their control, including poles, wires and other necessary apparatus, upon, over and under such ways. Such a contract may provide for payments by such cities over a period not exceeding 5 years.

Sec. 2. Installation of parking meters. Any such city may, for the purposes of enforcing its ordinances, install, operate and maintain mechanical devices known as parking meters and may establish and charge a fee by the deposit of coins in such meters for the privilege of parking vehicles on ways.
