STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Regulating the Advertising for Sale of Malt Liquors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Overhanging signs advertising malt liquors, regulated. No sign or other device advertising the sale of malt liquors shall be attached to any building, post, wire or any fixture so that it shall hang over any public street or sidewalk.
