RESOLVE, Limiting Weir Fishing for Salmon in Penobscot River.

Taking of salmon from Penobscot river, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries, be and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation, prohibiting the killing or taking of salmon from the tidal waters of the Penobscot river, or from the tidal waters of its tributaries at any time by the use of weirs, traps or other similar apparatus nearer the source of said Penobscot river than where the line between the towns of Winterport and Hampden and that line extended crosses said river, under a penalty of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, and a further penalty of \$10 for each salmon so taken or killed.
