STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Fishing for Gain or Hire.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 27, amended. Section 27 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 27. Fishing for gain or hire prohibited; exceptions; penalty. Whoever shall, for the whole or any part of the time, engage in the business or occupation of fishing on any of the in and waters of the state above tide-waters, for salmon, togue, trout, black bass, pickerel, or white perch or white fish for gain or hire, shall for every such offense pay a fine of \$50 and costs, except that pickerel legally taken in the counties county of Washington, Aroostook, Hancock, Penobscot, Somerset, Piscataquis and Franklin may be sold by the person taking the same.'
