**RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of
Dennysville.**

Taking of clams in Dennysville, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Dennysville, shall take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from within the limits of the tide-waters of the town of Dennysvills. Whoever violates any provision of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$200.
