**RESOLVE, Relating to Digging for Clams in Certain Waters.**

---

**Digging for clams in waters adjacent to Lubec, Trescott, Edmonds, and Whiting, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation shall dig clams for commercial purposes within the waters adjacent to the towns of Lubec, Trescott, Edmonds and Whiting; unless they have been resident in one of the respective towns for at least 6 months.

Non-residents may take such clams up to 1 bushel per day.

Whoever violates the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
