STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of Perry.

Taking of clams in Perry, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal rule and regulation numbered 32 as published in the official rules and regulations of the department of sea and shore fisheries, and is hereby further directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Perry, shall take more than ½ bushel of clams in any I day from within the limits of the tide-waters of the town of Perry. Whoever violates any provisions of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50, nor more than \$200.
