STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Carrie Ramsdell Fisher, of St. Albans.

Carrie Ramsdell Fisher; state pension. Resolved: That a pension be, and hereby is, granted to Carrie Ramsdell Fisher, of St. Albans, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for teachers' pensions. Said pension shall begin 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Carrie Ramsdell Fisher was born in Ripley, Maine, on April 11, 1864, and has served as a teacher in the public schools for a period exceeding 25 years but less than 30 years. More than 20 of the 25 years required for a minimum pension have been in the public schools of the state of Maine, and the remainder of her teaching service has been in another state. She has taught but 10 1/3 of the 15 years required to have been in this state subsequent to her service outside of the state.
