### **RESOLVE, Regulating Hunting and Trapping of Muskrats.**

---

**Hunting and trapping of muskrats, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rules and regulations regulating the hunting and trapping of muskrats:

1. Closing lake Alamoosook and Dead river and tributaries in Orland in the county of Hancock for a period of 3 years.
2. Closing Black stream, so-called, and all its tributaries situated in the towns of Stetson, Carmel, Hermon, Levant and Glenburn, all in the county of Penobscot for a period of 2 years; provided, however that said stream and tributaries shall be open thereafter during the month of April only.
3. Closing Fields pond, also its tributaries, and outlet to the dam at East Orrington, said waters located in the town of Orrington, in the county of Penobscot, and the town of Bucksport, in the county of Hancock for a period of 2 years; provided, however that said stream, tributaries and outlet shall be open thereafter during the month of April only.
4. Closing Passadumkeag river and its tributaries, except from April 1st to April 30th each year.
