S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Willis Bartlett, of Stillwater.

Willis Bartlett; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of Willis Bartlett, of Stillwater, the sum of \$10 as a full and final settlement against the state, for damage to his house by deer; to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On November 12, 1936, a deer broke into Mr. Bartlett's house. It was inspected by Deputy Mallay.
