**RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Lucie F. Parlin of  
Dover-Foxcroft.**

---

**Lucie F. Parlin; state pension. Resolved:** That a pension of \$25 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Lucie F. Parlin, of Dover-Foxcroft, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1937, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature. Chapter 43 of the resolves of 1925 is hereby repealed.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Under the provisions of chapter 43 of the resolves of 1925, a pension was granted to Robert F. Parlin, a disabled World War veteran. Mr. Parlin was then in a sanatorium and the pension was no doubt allowed for the benefit of his wife and dependent children. The money has not been used that way and Mrs. Parlin and her 7 children have been obliged to call on the town for public assistance, while Mr. Parlin is understood to have used the pension for his own benefit. Mrs. Parlin is in urgent need of aid and worthy to receive it.
