RESOLVE, in Favor of Harry C. Austin & Co., Ellsworth, for Burial Expenses of Mark Arsenault, Having no Known Settlement in the State.

Harry C. Austin & Co., appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Harry C. Austin & Co., of Ellsworth, the sum of \$85, for burial expenses of Mark Arsenault, having no known settlement in the state; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mark Arsenault was an honorably discharged veteran of the World War. He died in 1933 and was buried by Harry C. Austin & Co., of Ellsforth, and they have been unable to collect for his burial expenses and feel that the state should assume the bill.
