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AN ACT Relating to the Consumption of Liquor on the Premises.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**P. L., 1935, c. 157, amended.** Chapter 157 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended by adding to the 10th paragraph thereof the following words :

‘provided, however, that not more than 1 license for the sale of malt liquor to be consumed on the premises where sold shall be issued for each 1000 population or major portion thereof, and not more than 1 license for the sale of malt liquor not to be consumed on the premises where sold shall be issued for each 1000 population or major portion thereof. **Provided,** further, however, that the state liquor commission may in its discretion issue short term malt liquor licenses to places of business in summer resorts to meet the demand of seasonal population.’
