STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT to Incorporate the "Maine State Fair Society."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. "Maine State Fair Society" created. E. F. Abbott, Winslow Hayden, Eileen Jackson, H. C. Edwards, George E. Bearce, L. E. Flanders, Benjamin Jones, E. H. Cubberley, Rex V. Bridges, E. A. Bickford, J. S. Seavey, their associates, successors and assigns be, and they are hereby created a corporation by the name of "The Maine State Fair Society" with power by that name to sue and be sued, use a common seal, make by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state and to hold and exercise all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.
- Sec. 2. Term of incorporation; meeting. The incorporators named in this act are hereby constituted an executive committee of said society and shall hold their offices until the 1st Monday of May 1943.

The 1st meeting of the society shall be called by any member of the incorporators by mailing written notice to each incorporator.

Sec. 3. Choice of officers. At the 1st meeting of the society and at each annual meeting thereafter, the said incorporators shall organize by

choice of president, secretary, treasurer and such other officers as may be deemed necessary, and 7 members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Sec. 4. Society may hold property. Said society may take and hold property, real and personal, to an amount the annual income of which shall not exceed \$25,000 to be applied exclusively to the advancement of agriculture, horticulture, and arts connected therewith, and to develop the important resources of the state.
