IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Representation of Indian Tribes at the Legislature.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 282, amended. Section 282 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933, as amended by section 1 of chapter 273 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 282. Biennial election of tribe. Biennially on the even numbered years, on the 1st Tuesday of ~~November~~ **September**, the Penobscot Indians shall hold their election for the choice of governor and lieutenant-governor of said tribe, and a representative at the legislature of this state. The agent of said tribe shall give notice of the time and place, 7 days before said day of election, by posting notices thereof, 1 at his office and 1 in some conspicuous place on Old Town island. Said agent shall receive, sort, and count the votes given in at said election, in presence of the members of the tribe, and shall give to those elected certificates thereof.'
