**RESOLVE, in Favor of the University of Maine for Operations and
Maintenance of the Brunswick Campus.**

Maintenance and operation of Brunswick campus; appropriation. Resolved: That in order to provide for the continued operation and maintenance of the Brunswick campus for the University of Maine for such period of time as may appear to the Board of Trustees to be necessary in order to provide for a total enrollment in the University of more than 4,000 but less than 4,800 students, the amount of \$150,000 be and hereby is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1948 and the sum of \$150,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1949; provided, however, that in the event of termination of the Brunswick operation during the next fiscal biennium the amount of the appropriation for the year of termination to be withheld from or returned by the University shall be determined by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

It is the present intention of the Trustees of the University to terminate the Brunswick operation as soon as the students now there can be moved to the Orono campus, unless the legislature appropriates money for the express purpose of continuance at Brunswick. Reference may be had to the statement of the Trustees in the Resolve in Favor of the University of Maine for General Operations.
