STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relative to Night Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 67, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 67 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall have in his possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal, or part thereof, taken in violation of the provisions of this section except as provided in section 97. Any person convicted of a violation under the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$50 and costs for the 1st offense, \$500 and costs and 3 months in jail for the 2nd offense and \$1,000 and costs and 9 months in jail for the 3rd offense, which fine and costs shall not be suspended.'
