Senate Amendment "A" to S.P. 144, L.D. 339, a bill, "An Act to Validate the Use of Check Marks in Elections." Amend said bill by adding at the end of section 5, thereof, the following:

'Wherever a cross (X) has heretofore been required, including referendum elections held pursuant to private and special acts, a cross (X) or a check mark ($\sqrt{}$) shall both be valid.'

Further amend said bill by adding at the end thereof a new section as follows:

"<u>Sec. 6. R. S., c. 80, § 52, amended</u>. Section 52 of chapter 80 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the 10th sentence and inserting in place thereof the following:

"The ballots shall be so printed as to give each voter a clear opportunity to designate by a cross (X) or a check mark (/) in a square at the right of the name and designation of each candidate, his choice of candidates and his canswer to the question submitted, and in the ballot may be printed such words as will aid the voter to do this, as "vote for one," "vote for three," "yes," "no," and the like.! "
