STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Convictions Affecting Credibility.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 128. Conviction affects credibility only. No person is incompetent to testify in any court or legal proceeding in consequence of having been convicted of an offense; but such conviction of a felony may be shown to affect his credibility.'
