Senate Amendment "A" to H. P. 1652, L. D. 1346, Bill "An Act Protecting the Right of Members and Non-members of Labor Organizations to the Opportunity to Work."

Amend said Bill by adding at the end of the 1st paragraph of that part designated "Sec. 41-A", the following underlined paragraph:

'Nothing in this section shall prohibit the execution, performance and enforcement of a union shop contract, so called, wherein an employed person shall be required, as a condition of continuing employment by the state or any subdivision thereof or any corporation, individual or association of any kind, to join and maintain membership in a labor organization, provided, however, that an employee shall not be required, as a condition of employment, to join a labor organization during the first 30 days of his employment.'
