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Amend said Bill by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"R. S., c. 19, §85, amended. The 1st sentence of section 85 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 348 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof: 'No motor vehicle or trailer which with or without load is wider than 96 inches over all shall be operated upon any way or bridge; except that motor vehicles or trailers hauling firewood, pulpwood, logs or bolts may be operated on any way or bridge if the width of the load does not exceed 102 inches; provided, however, that a strip 3 inches thick shall extend along the sides of the platform securely fastened to the platform of the vehicle or trailer in order that the load shall pitch to the center of said vehicle or trailer: and provided further, that each vehicle or trailer shall carry a solid-boarded tailboard or 5 stakes evenly spaced of sufficient strength to maintain the weight of the load, and such load at no place along its length shall be higher than the tailboard or stakes."
