STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Shipment and Transportation of Clams, Quahogs and Mussels.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 95, repealed and replaced. Section 95 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 95. Shipment and transportation of clams, quahogs and mussels regulated; penalty. Between the 1st day of June and the 30th day of September, both days inclusive, of each year no person, firm or corporation as principal or by a servant or agent shall ship or transport in any manner or offer for shipment or transportation either directly or indirectly any clams, quahogs or mussels either in the shell or shucked, from Washington, Hancock, Knox or Waldo county beyond the limits of the state or to any of the following counties: Lincoln, Sagadahoc, Cumberland or York; provided, however, that an exception shall be made to clams, quahogs or mussels which have been canned, packed or barreled between the 1st day of October and the 31st day of May. Any person, firm or corporation as principal or by a servant or agent who ships, transports, offers for shipment or transportation or who attempts to ship or transport clams,

quahogs or mussels in violation of any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for the 1st offense, and by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$200 for each subsequent offense.'
