RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Grace Merrill Cutts, of Saco.

Teacher's pension granted to Grace Merrill Cutts, of Saco. Resolved: That a special pension be, and hereby is, granted to Grace Merrill Cutts, of Saco, comparable with that paid under the teachers' noncontributory pension law, based on 25 years of teaching service, as is now or may hereafter be provided by the legislature, to be paid quarterly from the general fund. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1949 and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF .FACTS

Grace Merrill Cutts taught $23\frac{1}{2}$ years in the city of Saco and is now 65 years of age. In addition to the $23\frac{1}{2}$ years, she taught in Saco under the W. P. A. program, which would have brought her over the 25-year period. She is a widow, was a rural school teacher and the rural schools now have been abandoned so there is no opportunity there for her to complete the $1\frac{1}{2}$ years necessary.
