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**RESOLVE, in Favor of Ralph L. Hunt of Thomaston.**

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**Ralph L. Hunt; to be given credit. Resolved:** That Ralph L. Hunt of Thomaston be given credit for 12 full years of teaching service rendered in Hebron Academy, to be applied toward meeting requirements for a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ralph L. Hunt was graduated from Bates College, class of 1903, and has been awarded honorary degrees from Colby College and the University of Maine.

He has had 44 years of educational experience. Fourteen years of this service was in the public school system of Glendive, Montana. Nine years were spent in Maine's public schools. For 21 years he served as headmaster of Hebron Academy.

To meet the provisions of the State Employees' Retirement law, Mr. Hunt asks that 12 years of his Hebron Academy service be declared creditable for retirement purposes in order that he may meet that provision of the law which requires 20 years of service in Maine, of which 15 years immediately preceding retirement must have been in this state.
