RESOLVE, in Favor of Milton A. Philbrook, of Westbrook.

Milton A. Philbrook; credit for teaching service. Resolved: That Milton A. Philbrook, of Westbrook, be given credit for 30 months of teaching service rendered in the United States Navigation School (Rockland), to be applied toward meeting requirements for a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes as amended.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Milton A. Philbrook was graduated from Colby College, Class of 1918. In addition to study related to his World War I naval service, he has added, through regular professional courses, more than an additional year to his initial preparation.

Over 28 years have been spent in state educational service. Currently, he is completing his 22nd year as principal of Westbrook High School.

To meet the provisions of the State Employees' Retirement Law, Mr. Philbrook asks that the 30 months spent as an instructor at the United States Navigation School (Rockland) be declared creditable for retirement purposes in order that he may realize maximum benefit of the law as soon as he becomes eligible for retirement privileges in the near future.
