RESOLVE, in Favor of Frank F. McGinley of Eddington.

Frank F. McGinley; disability retirement allowance granted. Resolved: That upon the application of Frank F. McGinley of Eddington a disability retirement allowance shall be granted, based on the service of Mr. McGinley as a teacher for 22 years in the state; and be it further

Resolved: That such disability retirement allowance be granted notwithstanding the provisions of subsection I of section 7 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. McGinley taught school in Maine for 22 years and contributed to the teachers' retirement system since 1930. He was in the military service for 2 years, during which time he received a head injury in an automobile accident. After receiving his discharge from the service, he returned to his former position as teacher at Bangor High School; but was obliged to resign in April, 1946, because of ill health. He has not withdrawn his contributions to the Retirement System and had hoped to be able to resume teaching; but his disability has been determined as permanent and he will not be able to do so. The purposes of this resolve is to allow a disability retirement allowance to be granted on his application for the same after he had left his employment. The retirement law provides that such application shall be made before leaving his employment.
