**AN ACT Relating to License Plate for Motor Vehicle Owners Who
Operate Amateur Radio Stations.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, §§ 37-A-37-D, additional. Chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto 4 new sections, to be numbered 37-A to 37-D, inclusive, to read as follows:

'Special License Plates

Sec. 37-A. Special license plate to motor vehicle owners who operate amateur radio stations. Owners of motor vehicles who are residents of this state and who hold an unrevoked and unexpired official amateur radio station license issued by the federal communications commission, upon application, accompanied by proof of ownership of such amateur radio station license, complying with the state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles and upon the payment of an additional fee of \$1, shall be issued license plate for private passenger cars or trucks, upon which shall be inscribed the official amateur radio call letters of such applicant as assigned by the federal communications commission.

Sec. 37-B. Rules and regulations. The secretary of state shall make such rules and regulations as may be necessary to ascertain compliance with all state license laws relating to use and operation of a private passenger car or truck before issuing these special plates, and all applications for such plates shall be made to the secretary of state.

Sec. 37-C. Lists furnished by secretary of state. The secretary of state shall, on or before the 1st day of January of each year, furnish to the sheriff of each county in the state an alphabetically arranged list of the names, addresses and license plate letters of each person to whom a license plate is issued under the provisions of sections 37-A to 37-D, inclusive, and it shall be the duty of the sheriffs of the state to maintain and to keep current such lists for public information and inquiry.

Sec. 37-D. Application. Sections 37-A to 37-D, inclusive, are supplemental to the motor vehicle licensing laws of Maine and nothing herein shall be construed as abridging or amending such laws.'
