AN ACT Relating to Smoking in Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 85, § 34, amended. Section 34 of chapter 85 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 34. Lighting or smoking pipe, cigarette or cigar in mills, passenger buses, shipyards, etc., contrary to notice; penalty.** No person shall enter any mill, millyard, **passenger bus or portion thereof**, factory, machine shop, shipyard, covered bridge, stable or other building with a lighted pipe, cigarette, or cigar, or shall light or smoke any pipe, cigarette, or cigar therein under a penalty of \$5, if a notice in plain legible characters that no smoking is allowed therein is kept in a conspicuous position over or near each principle entrance to such building or place; and whoever defaces, removes, or destroys such notice forfeits \$10.'
