STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Establishing Chapman Bird Sanctuary.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto, in alphabetical order, the following:

'Chapman Bird Sanctuary: No person shall, except as herein provided, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at, molest or kill any bird, within the following described territory situated in the town of Chapman: Beginning at a point where the Bangor and Aroostook railroad crosses West Chapman road, extending in a southerly direction on the west side of said road a distance of 1 1/3 miles and in a westerly direction 3/4 of a mile; also on the east side of West Chapman at a point beginning at Cross road, so called, and extending in a southerly direction on the east side of said road a distance of 1 1/3 miles and in an easterly direction 3/4 of a mile.'
