STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Organization of Police Department of City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 1, amended. The 1st sentence of section I of article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended by section I of chapter 95 and section I of chapter 177, both of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The police department shall consist of a police commission of 5 members, hereinafter in this article referred to as the commission, to be appointed by the mayor, a chief of police, ≥ 3 captains of police, I captain of detectives, ≥ 4 lieutenants of police, 4 sergeants of police, I police matron, I police clerk and such number of patrolmen, not to exceed I for each 900 of the population of the city, as the commission shall deem necessary, the entire personnel of which as existing when this charter takes effect shall continue subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.'
