STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Costs of Children in Maine School for the Deaf.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 23, § 172-A, amended. Section 172-A of chapter 23 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 56 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 172-A. Costs. For each child admitted to the school, the town in which the child has a settlement, if any is a resident shall pay to the state, to be credited to the general fund, an amount equal to the per capita cost of instruction and equipment in a public elementary school for a normal child in that town.'
