**AN ACT Relating to the Executive Office.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 11, § 1, amended.** The first 2 paragraphs of section 1 of chapter 11 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'The governor shall have his official residence at Augusta during his term of office, and shall keep his office at the state house open ~~either personally or by his private secretary~~ for the transaction of the business of the state during ~~4 business days of each week~~ **all normal working hours of the state house.**

~~The~~ **In the absence of the governor, his private secretary shall be in attendance and the private secretary of the governor shall devote his entire time to the duties of his office.'**
