**AN ACT to Authorize Liquor Commission to Hire Space in Stores for Sale
of Liquor.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 9, repealed and replaced. Section 9 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 9. Special stores. The commission shall have authority to establish in cities and towns which vote in favor of the operation of state stores under local option provisions and where it appears to the commission that a state store used exclusively and year around for sale of spirituous and vinous liquor is unpractical, special or temporary stores to be occupied exclusively for the purpose of selling liquor other than malt liquor in sealed bottles, containers or original packages for consumption off the premises, or may hire space to be under exclusive control of the commission in other stores, all such special, temporary or space in other stores to be under and subject to control by such regulation as the commission may determine.'
