STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting and Fishing Licenses for Aliens.

Be in enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 58, sub-§ II, repealed. Subsection II of section 58 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 58, sub-§ V, amended. Subsection V of section 58 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘V. Any ~~citizen of the United States~~ **person** shall be eligible for any resident license required under the provisions of this chapter, providing such person is domiciled in Maine with the intention to reside here, and who has resided in this state during the 3 months next prior to the date an application is filed for any license under the provisions of this chapter.’

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 33, § 59, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 59 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘The fee for a non-resident ~~or alien~~ for a trapping license shall be \$200.’

Sec. 4. R. S., c. 33, § 63, sub-§ III, amended. The 1st paragraph of

subsection III of section 63 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No non-resident ~~or alien~~ shall hunt or have in his possession any wild bird, animal, or parts thereof, without first having procured from the commissioner or his authorized agent a written license which shall be kept upon the person while hunting or transporting such birds and animals, and which shall be exhibited upon request to any warden, employee of this department, or guide.'
