STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Department of Public Buildings.

Department of Public Buildings improvements; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund the sum of \$15,000 for improvements to the state house heating system. Such expenditure shall be as recommended by the superintendent of buildings and approved by the governor and council.

Any balances at June 30, 1954 shall be carried forward to the 1954-55 fiscal year, but all unencumbered appropriation balances shall lapse June 30, 1955.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the opinion of the committee on appropriations and financial affairs that an expenditure of \$15,000 for improvements to the state house heating system will be sound investment and that it will accomplish operating economies consistent with the investment.

Below is an itemized tabulation of construction and improvement needs

of the state house showing those items requested by the department and those items recommended by the governor:
