AN ACT Relating to Trespass.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 118, § 39-A, repealed and replaced. Section 39-A of chapter 118 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 327 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec.39-A. Trespass on commercial or residential property; penalty. Whoever wilfully enters in and upon any land commercially used, including parking lots, or whoever wilfully enters in and upon residential property or the improved lands appertaining to any farm, summer camp or cottage, or whoever parks any motor vehicle in any private drive or way in a manner to block the same or on a public highway in such a manner as to block the entrance to a private driveway, gate or barway, after being forbidden to do so by the owner or occupant thereof, either personally or by an appropriate notice posted conspicuously on the premises, shall be guilty of trespass and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
