STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR

RESOLVE, Permitting the Building of a Wharf in Maranacook Lake.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the hurricane of the past several weeks has damaged a wharf in Maranacook lake; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary to make a permanent wharf before the lake freezes; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore, be it

Building of wharf permitted. Resolved: That Laurence H. Foster, his heirs and assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and control a wharf in the waters of Lake Maranacook, in the town of Winthrop, the same to be located at some point within 75 feet north from the north side of the bridge across the Mill stream, so called. In no case shall the wharf extend more than 20 feet into the lake from the high water mark.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
