AN ACT Relating to Bartlett's Island as a Game Preserve.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, deer and other wild animals are being slaughtered on Bartlett's Island in Hancock County to the detriment and peril of the people of Hancock County; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary to preserve our wild animals; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Bartlett's Island game preserve. No person shall, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or any game or other wild bird within the following described territory: On Bartlett's Island in Hancock County.

Sec. 2. Amending and repealing clause. All acts and resolves or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed or amended to conform to the provisions of this act.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
