RESOLVE, in Favor of Florence Watson of Richmond.

Florence Watson; to be given credit. Resolved: That Florence Watson, of Richmond, be given sufficient credit for teaching service to enable her to qualify for a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Miss Watson was a teacher in the elementary schools of Bath from September, 1916, to June, 1932, and was compelled to leave her teaching job in 1932 because of poor health. She is now bedridden with arthritis and has no visible means of support.
