**RESOLVE, in Favor of a Retirement Allowance for J. Harrison Bailey of  
Hallowell.**

---

**J. Harrison Bailey; retirement allowance. Resolved:** That a retirement allowance of \$112.75 be, and hereby is, granted to J. Harrison Bailey of Hallowell to be paid monthly from the funds of the Maine State Retirement System. Such retirement benefits shall be effective from January 23, 1954 and continue during his life. Such retirement allowance shall not be payable until the said J. Harrison Bailey has paid to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$1,775.17 which has been refunded to Mr. Bailey by the System.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Olive E. Bailey, the late wife of J. Harrison Bailey, had served the State of Maine some 29 years and 5 months. She passed away July 30, 1953. No retirement benefits had accrued to Mrs. Bailey at the time of her death under the statutes, and the purpose of this resolve is to provide security payable to Mr. Bailey upon the anniversary of Mrs. Bailey's 60th birthday, based on the amount she would have received had she lived to retirement age on January 23, 1954, when her named beneficiary, Mr. Bailey, would have been automatically covered under the provisions of Option 2 under section 11 of chapter 64 of the revised statutes of 1954.
