STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Installations Within Highway Limits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 23, § 89, amended. The first paragraph of section 89 of chapter 23 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall install, erect or construct, or cause to be installed, erected or constructed any such installations as buildings, gasoline pumps or other fixtures in or upon any state or state aid highway or within 33 feet of the center line, or within 20 feet from the edge of the paved portion, of said highway; and such state or state aid highway shall be deemed the full width of the right of way as laid out by the State, the county or the town. This paragraph shall not apply to the installations or other property devoted to the public use of any public utility or district or to underground pipe lines or to the installations or other property now in existence on August 6, 1949.'
