AN ACT to Place a Bounty on Porcupines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 28-A, additional. Chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 28-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 28-A. **Bounty.** A bounty of 25c is placed on porcupines killed. Such bounty shall be paid by town treasurers on delivery to them of the porcupine’s nose. The Commissioner of Agriculture is authorized and directed to reimburse each town treasurer on satisfactory evidence that the bounty has been paid. Such reimbursement shall be made from the appropriation for dog license claims.’
