IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications of Judge and Duties of Recorder of
Brunswick Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1903, c. 277, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 277 of the private and special laws of 1903 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Brunswick municipal court established. A municipal court is hereby established in and for the town of Brunswick, in the county of Cumberland, which shall be called the municipal court for the town of Brunswick; and said court shall consist of one judge, a citizen of said town and a **duly qualified attorney at law**, who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Council, and who shall be duly sworn.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1903, c. 277, § 8, amended. Section 8 of chapter 277 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding after the second sentence thereof, a new sentence, to read as follows:

'The recorder shall sign all original writs and processes and only in his absence or when his office shall be vacant shall said writs and processes be signed by the judge.'
