SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED BY THE THIRD LEGISLATURE AT ITS SESSION IN JANUARY 1823.

CHAPTER CLI.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of North Salem.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the following described tract of land, in the county of Somerset, bounded as follows, viz.: beginning on the east line of the town of Phillips, at the south east corner of lot number fifteen, in the sixth range of lots in said town; thence running a westerly course on the south line of the sixth range to the south west corner of lot number ten, in said sixth range; thence running a northerly course on the west line of lots numbered ten, and across a gore of land, and in the same direction, to a point one mile north of the south line of the million acres; thence east on a parallel line with the south line of the million acres, to Kingfield west line; thence southerly on said Kingfield west line to the south west corner of Kingfield; thence east on the line of said town to the northeast corner of lot number six, in range M, in Freeman; thence south to the south east corner of lot number six, in range H; thence west on the south line of range H, to the east line of Phillips; thence south to the

bounds first mentioned ; with the inhabitants thereof, be, and the same hereby is incorporated into a town by the name of North Salem. And the inhabitants are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of towns within this State, do or may by law enjoy.

Taxes assessed by Phillips and Freeman, how collected.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all the inhabitants of the town of North Salem, who, prior to the passage of this act, were inhabitants of the towns of Phillips and Freeman, shall be severally holden to pay all taxes now duly assessed upon them in the several towns to which they belong, in the same manner they would have been, had not this act passed ; and all officers shall have the same right to enforce the collection of said taxes as they heretofore have had.

State taxes how apportioned.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That in all State taxes which may be granted by the Legislature, previous to a new valuation, one sixth part of the taxes which would have been set to the said towns of Phillips and Freeman, according to the last valuation, shall be set to the said town of North Salem.

First meeting.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That Samuel Blake, Esquire, of Phillips, in the county of Somerset, be, and he hereby is authorised to call the first meeting of said inhabitants, by issuing his warrant to an inhabitant thereof, directing him to notify said inhabitants to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual meetings.

CHAPTER CLII.

AN additional ACT relating to the Ministerial Fund in the town of Bridgton, in the County of Cumberland.

Trustees to pay interest of fund to Minister thereto entitled, annually.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the trustees of said fund are hereby authorized and empowered to pay over, annually, the interest of said fund, to such minister of the gospel as is by their act of incorporation, entitled to receive it : instead of
