CHAPTER CCLIV.

AN ACT additional to the Act to incorporate the Proprietors of Stearns' Pond Canal.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That instead of the toll granted to the proprietors of Stearns' toll allowed Pond Canal, in their act of incorporation, passed for lumber. January 31, A. D. 1823, the said proprietors shall be allowed to take and receive for their use, at the following rate, to wit: For every thousand feet of lumber which shall pass down said Canal, five cents.

CHAPTER CCLV.

AN ACT to annex part of the land of Jonathan Goodridge to Canaan.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That such parts of Lots No. 3, A. 4, G. 2, and Check No. 4 G 2. belonging to Jonathan Goodridge of Canaan, in the county of Somerset, as lies within the town of Warsaw, be, and the same hereby is set off from said town of Warsaw, and annexed to said town of Canaan.

CHAPTER CCLVI.

AN ACT for the preservation of Alewives and other Fish in Salmon Falls River.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this act, no person shall be al-Penalty for lowed to fish for Alewives or any other fish, in that fishing in cerpart of Salmon Falls River, which lies within this Salmon Falls State, between Shorey's or Thompson's Brook and by dip net, &q. the Bridge across said river leading from South-Berwick to Somersworth, by the use of any seine,
